

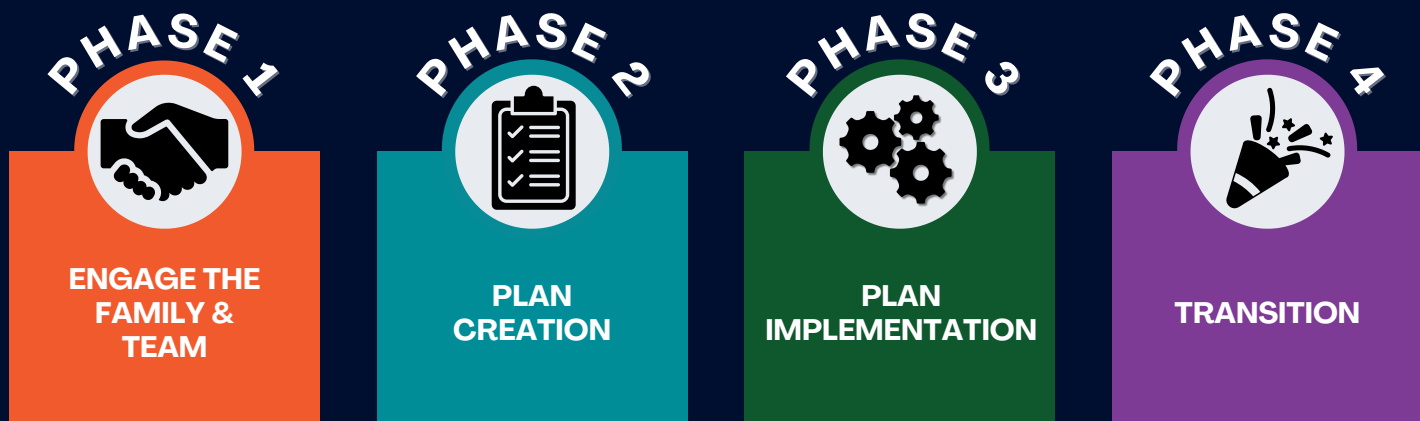


BASICS OF WRAPAROUND

Wraparound is a team-based, family-centered approach providing intensive, individualized support to help youth remain safely at home and connected to their communities.



THE 4 PHASES OF WRAPAROUND



What Makes Wraparound Unique?

Wraparound includes four Key Elements that must all be present for the approach to be considered high-quality and true to the model. Each element reflects essential skills and practices that staff must consistently demonstrate in Wraparound implementation.



GROUNDING IN A STRENGTHS PERSPECTIVE

Identify and build on the capabilities, knowledge, and skills of a youth, family, and team.



DRIVEN BY UNDERLYING NEEDS

If the underlying need is identified, named, and met, behavior will change.



SUPPORTED BY AN EFFECTIVE TEAM

An invested team made of people who know and support the family, and are willing to follow through on their roles and responsibilities.



DETERMINED BY FAMILIES

Youth and their families have influence, choice, and authority over services and supports.

INTENDED POPULATION

Wraparound is intended for:

- Youth at risk of residential placement, hospitalization, or juvenile detention
- Youth & their families with frequent crises, emergency room visits, and/or service disruptions
- Youth with complex trauma, co-occurring disorders, and/or developmental concerns
- Youth & their families who are working with several systems or professionals at the same time
